LITERACY INTERNATIONAL USA REPRESENTATIVE MR. MUSTAFA TAJRI VISITS THE AIMS SCHOOL & COLLEGE

Innovations in Education

THE AIMS CONDUCTS COMPREHENSIVE FIVE-DAY TEACHER TRAINING AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

The AIMS School and College successfully conducted a comprehensive five-day Teacher Training and Professional Development Program from December 22 to 26, 2025, at The AIMS Multipurpose Hall. This intensive training brought together all teaching staff from pre-school through senior school for professional development sessions.

DAY 1

Islamic Values and Teaching Techniques

CHAIRMAN PCE PROF. SYED IMTIAZ ALI RIZVI ADDRESSES PRESS CONFERENCE ANNOUNCING NATIONAL ALLIANCE OF PRIVATE SCHOOLS



Prof. Syed Imtiaz Ali Rizvi, Chairman of Pakistan Chamber of Education Islamabad and CEO of The AIMS School and College, addressed a significant press conference at the National Press Club of Pakistan, Islamabad on January 10, 2026. PDC SESSION ON SELF-ASSESSMENT AND IDENTIFYING PERSONAL ABILITIES

A Professional Development Center (PDC) session was held at The AIMS School and College on January 31, 2026, as part of the weekly guest lecturing series organized in collaboration with The AIMS Alumni Association. Dr. Syed Abbas Ali Naqvi, a professor, academic leader, and IT consultant working at national and international levels, delivered an insightful session on "Assessing Your Abilities".

Dr. Naqvi explained that assessment is an integral part of life at every stage. Students are assessed through school exams, then by broader organizations like FBISE in senior classes, followed by university entrance tests, and eventually by employers in professional life. He emphasized that since we will be assessed by others throughout our lives, it is crucial to assess ourselves before others assess us.



The speaker highlighted that Allah has given every person uncountable abilities, many of which remain hidden. As young people, students possess numerous talents waiting to be discovered. He noted that some individuals identify and develop their abilities, making their mark in history, while others never recognize these gifts and live unfulfilled lives. The first critical step is to identify your abilities - recognizing that some may be stronger than others, but all can be developed with effort. Dr. Naqvi stressed that assessment should be outcome-based, focusing on the target you want to accomplish. He emphasized that targets should be measurable and quantitative to track progress effectively. He discussed various abilities that students should develop, including communication skills, problem solving, creativity,

logical and critical thinking, and leadership skills - noting that leadership is particularly rare and valuable. He emphasized that feedback from teachers is more valuable than just receiving grades, as it provides guidance for improvement. Dr. Naqvi encouraged students to analyze past assessments as a form of data analysis, looking not just at single assessments but at progress over a period of time. The speaker emphasized that self-assessment is not a one-time activity but an ongoing process essential for leading a progressive and successful life. This comprehensive session equipped students with practical tools for self-evaluation and personal development, encouraging them to take ownership of their growth and future success through systematic self-assessment.
